REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about October 4, 2022, the City of Piney Point Village, will authorize the use of grant funds for a project known as Piney Point Village ARPA-drainage-EA for the purpose of storm drainage improvements to reduce localized flooding in the community.

Description of the Proposed Project:

Drainage Improvements:

The project will occur in the Piney Point Village, Harris County, Texas in the following location:

• Existing ROW along S. Piney Point Road from Carlton Park Ct. south 600 feet.

The project generally consists of the removal of an existing 96" corrugated metal storm sewer pipe along the east side of S. Piney Point Road from Carlton Park Ct to Buffalo Bayou and replacement with approximately 600 linear feet of 9'x9' reinforced box culvert. Other items associated with the work include clearing and grubbing of the project area of existing trees and vegetation, the removal and replacement of storm sewer inlets and pipes to drain the right-of-way, and bank stabilization at the project outfall.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

Piney Point Village certifies that Mark Kobelan, in their capacity as Mayor consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. This certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows Piney Point Village to use grant funds.

OBJECTIONS TO AUTHORIZATION OF USE OF FUNDS

The City will accept objections to its use of funds and Piney Point Village's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of Piney Point Village; (b) Piney Point Village; has omitted a required step or failed to make a required decision or finding; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized before approval of use of funds; or (d) a Federal agency has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be received by September 15, 2022.
